Dear Mr. Martin:

Thank you for your letter of 18 January in which you discussed the alternative costs of the USAF training at Yale and the availability of the Yale training materials for DLI.

As indicated during our recent telephone conversation, our study of our FY-66 training load requires that we adhere to the provisions of the FY-65 contract, including the training, and make the April 1965 input in the Yale program the last class. This decision was necessary, since our in-house facilities do not have time to adequately prepare for handling the April input. It is anticipated that the FY-65 contract can be modified to provide for use of the university's facilities to house the students until the program is phased out in November 1965. This headquarters will explore and initiate action to implement such a modification. The determination of actual costs thereof will be subject to negotiation between the University and the Washington Procurement Division.

DLI is interested in acquiring the Grademaster Electronic Scoring Machine and all of the teaching materials offered in your letter. I must inform you that the procurement of the machine will be subject to inspection thereof and price negotiation with the Washington Procurement Division. We will also initiate the action on this matter. With respect to the training materials, I believe DLI can handle the packing and shipping of the materials directly with the University. We will advise our West Coast facility, which will be the consignee of the material, to make arrangements with the local government transportation office for issuance of a Government Bill of Lading to cover the shipment at government cost.



Your cooperation in making the transition of the USAF Program from Yale to DLIWC an orderly one is greatly appreciated.
